















City Camp @ AIC-CCMB, Hyderabad on 14th November 2019















BRBC'S City Camp was a one day event organized on 14<sup>th</sup> November 2019 at The Atal Incubation Centre- Centre for Cellular & Molecular Biology (AIC-CCMB), Hyderabad. The workshop introduced key aspects of science and technology based entrepreneurship. It was aimed at aspiring entrepreneurs who wished to get a broad overview of how to start and run a technology based enterprise. The event also promoted entrepreneurship development/awareness creation activities of AIC-CCMB.



The event started as Dr. Premnath & Dr. Priya Nagraj gave an overview of Venture Center that projected types of enterprises supported, incubator offerings, resources, facilities, events, social and scientific impact created. Followed by a welcome address from N. Madhusudhana Rao (CEO of AIC-CCMB). Dr. Rao gave an overview of various facilities at AIC-CCMB's Bio incubator including high end instrumental facilities available for entrepreneurs to use.

The Sessions were followed by 10 minute talk by 2 senior entrepreneurs who interacted with participants and told them about their entrepreneurship journey, hurdles faced by them and different ways they took and overcame those to become successful.



Dr. J. Venkateswara Rao, has done an extensive research in the toxicity of pesticides for more than three decades (Thirty-three years of track record) in the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR), Govt. of India. His company BhaPra BioSolutions Pvt. Ltd. mainly focused on to cut down the amount of pest infestation in storage of food grains, by developing chemically treated storage bags for food warehousing and conveyance. Particularly, aimed to produce a safer and novel treatment to aged grain technology; in which the deltamethrin as a sandwich layer for increasing efficacy, and user-friendly approach by eliminating the contact with neither the grains nor the people managing them. The current proposed technology would answer all the concerns, thereby reducing the economic burden pertaining to procurement of pesticide as well as the quality assurance by non-treatment of grains. To produce a novel, reusable insect pest protection woven/ non-woven and Knitted high density Polyethylene/Polypropylene plastic bags incorporated with deltamethrin (an active ingredient) for storage and shipping of food cereals, without contact with the dynamic ingredient. Secondly, mosquito repellent textiles protect the human beings from the bite of mosquitoes and thereby promising safety from the mosquitoborne diseases. Since, there is no effective vaccine available for the control of these diseases, prevention of mosquito bites is one of the main strategies to control or minimize the incidence of these diseases. Hence, BhaPra BioSolutions aimed to develop nano-formulated mosquito repellent clothing for military/security uniforms, with impregnating microencapsulated molecules and oils through robust methodology.

















**Dr Sridhar Rao** is a former Chief Scientist from the Centre for Cellular and Molecular Biology, Hyderabad and with a research career spanning for more than 3 decades.

Dr Sridhar is an accomplished Scientist in the field of monoclonal antibody generation, molecular diagnostics, development of novel photodynamic sensitizers for therapeutic and diagnostic applications. Hismajor contributions include development of DNA-based diagnostics for Ocularinfections, Septicemia, Acute Encephalitic Syndrome and AntibioticResistance. The work on DNA-based diagnosis of ocularinfections and photodynamic sensitizers has more than 25patents. Dr. Sridhar is at present ChiefScientificOfficer (CSO )at **Oncosimis Biotech Private Limited**, and is currently involved in generation of recombinant antibodies fo rtherapeutic and diagnostic applications.

Through this interactive discussion participants could learn from entrepreneurs about their experience in getting a product to market. Various challenges faced by entrepreneurs were discussed; some of them related to: investments, regulations, acquiring lab/office space, market penetration, and process involved in forming a company, rules, regulations and guidelines to follow.























 This sessions were followed by Introduction to UoH ASPIRE-BioNEST by Dr. Sreedhara R. Voleti, and explained how ASPIRE also manages the innovation and entrepreneurial activities at the University of Hyderabad through incubation of startup companies in various disciplines of science and technology.
